California Campus Compact Receives Certificate of Honor from City and County of San Francisco for 20 Years of Service, New Social Innovation Generation Initiative

San Francisco, CA – California Campus Compact, a coalition of leading colleges and universities throughout California, today announced that in a presentation ceremony conducted by the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco, the statewide higher education organization has been awarded a Certificate of Honor for its 20 years of service as a powerful catalyst to advance civic and community engagement throughout California.
